- 1. A Jury Duty Judge will be available between the hours of 8:30 a.m. and 9:30 a.m. on the first four mornings of each new two-week jury pool term.
- 2. After processing the jurors for attendance and orientation, the Jury Section will notify the Jury Duty Judge's chambers that those jurors who:
- a. by reason of their inability to meet the qualification criteria specified by law (language, residency, conviction of a felony) or;
- b. are requesting excusal because of an emergency which has arisen just prior to the reporting date,
- will be escorted to the Jury Duty Judge's Courtroom for the purpose of a hearing for these requests.
- 3. Upon hearing individual requests, the Jury Duty Judge will indicate his/her disposition of the request on the proposed order prepared by the Jury Section.
- 4. At the conclusion of the hearing, the Jury Clerk will escort the jurors back to the Assembly Room where the Judge's order will be executed.
