## ASSIGNMENT OF CASES TO SENIOR DISTRICT JUDGE C. CLYDE ATKINS

Pursuant to 28 U.S.C. §294(b) and the Guidelines for Providing Staff and Chambers to Senior Circuit and Senior District Judges of the Eleventh Circuit adopted October 8, 1990, the court hereby continues the assignment of the following cases (see attached) to Senior District Judge C. Clyde Atkins. As per Administrative Order 84-4, the Case Assignment System of the Court shall incorporate the following changes:

- Restructure the Case Assignment System so that Senior Judge Atkins is not assigned any Northern Division cases;
- 2. Restructure the Civil Case Assignment System such that Senior Judge Atkins draw becomes henceforth fifty percent of all civil cases assigned in all civil categories;
- 3. Restructure the Criminal Case Assignment System such that Senior Judge Atkins draw becomes henceforth fifty percent of all criminal cases assigned in Criminal Case Category I and II assignments only;
- 4. Remove Senior Judge Atkins from the Criminal Case Assignment System for all Criminal Case Category III, IV and V assignments;
- 5. Remove Senior Judge Atkins from all Habeas Corpus Petition Case Assignments wherein the prisoner is under a sentence of death; and
- 6. Remove Senior Judge Atkins from the monthly Duty Judge and Jury Duty Judge Assignments.

Under the provisions of paragraph 2.2 of the Judicial Council Guidelines, Senior Judge C. Clyde Atkins is entitled to one secretary and two law clerks.
