
ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER NO. 90-118

In re: Change of Criminal Case
Category, 82-327-Cr-Davis

Pursuant to our blind random assignment system, the United States Attorney is to submit a Certificate of Trial Attorney simultaneously with the filing of a criminal indictment or information. This Certificate is used by the Clerk of Court to ascertain the category of each case for random assignment to the court. Judge Edward B. Davis was randomly assigned 82-327-CR in Criminal Category IV, which, in 1982, indicated an estimated trial time of 15 to 30 days. The case required two separate trials for a total of 67 trial days, thus fulfilling the requirements for a Criminal Category V designation.

Therefore, the Clerk of Court is hereby directed to immediately remove Judge Davis' name from the Criminal Category V wheel, or (if his name is not in the wheel) to issue Judge Davis the appropriate credit upon the next refilling of the Criminal Category V wheel.
