1. The Clerk shall distribute the cases assigned to Judge Moore in which the United States of America is the litigant in the following manner:

(a) each active judge will receive four of Judge Moore's criminal cases and Senior Judge King will receive three pending criminal cases;

(b) the above will apply to only Category 1 and 2 cases; the Category 3 cases that involve defendants who have pleaded guilty and are awaiting sentencing will be handled by senior judges distributed on a random basis.

(c) the three Category 4 cases will be distributed on a basis to be determined at the next judges' meeting.

2. The civil cases assigned to Judge Moore in which the United States of America is a litigant will be distributed on a basis of four each for each active judge.


3. All Fort Pierce criminal and civil cases will be distributed first to the other four judges on the Fort Pierce

assignment wheel, this distribution to be made prior to reaching the overall total of cases indicated above. Magistrate Judge Lynch will handle the Magistrate duties on all Fort Pierce cases transferred under this order.

4. The Fort Lauderdale and West Palm Beach division criminal and civil cases will be distributed next to the judges on those assignment wheels.

5. On all cases other than Fort Pierce cases, the Magistrate Judge assigned to a case will continue to have responsibility for the case.
