Administrative Order 2007-68 modified the Miami Magistrate Judge Pairing Assignment Plan until April 1, 2011. Consistent with that order (amending prior orders 2005-09, 2002-02, 2002-58, 2003-112 and 2004-23), it is

ORDERED that commencing April 1, 2011 and for three years thereafter, the District and Magistrate Judges for Miami will be paired as follows:

In order to effect the orderly transfer of cases in accordance with the pairing plan, the following procedures apply:

1. Each Magistrate Judge shall retain until disposition, all previously referred fully briefed motions. Each Magistrate Judge shall dispose of all referred motions that become ripe for disposition prior to April 1, 2011 until all fully briefed motions have been ruled upon by the Magistrate Judge. The Magistrate Judges shall use their best efforts to dispose of all prior, ripe motions in cases assigned to District Judges with whom they are not paired within 60 days of the commencement of each three-year rotation. As required by past orders, at the conclusion of the 60-day period, each Magistrate Judge shall make a written status report to the past paired District Judge with copy to the Chief Judge about the cases retained by the Magistrate Judge.


Any consent trial, consent motion for summary judgment, and other "consent motion" shall remain with the Magistrate Judge who was assigned to the case when the consent was given.

2. In the event of a lower-case transfer to a District Judge or a recusal by a District Judge, the Clerk's Office shall reassign the case to the Magistrate Judge with whom the newly-assigned District Judge is paired.

3. All Magistrate Judge recusals shall be assigned to Magistrate Judge Ted E. Bandstra. Any recusal by Magistrate Bandstra shall be assigned to Magistrate Judge William C. Turnoff.

4. District Judges retain full discretion concerning the type and volume of matters referred. However, referrals shall be only to the "paired" Magistrate Judge, except for the criminal matters indicated in this order that may be referred to Magistrate Judge Barry Garber.
