ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER 2017-37

**IN RE: GENERAL LOCAL RULE 88.3;
AMENDMENT TO COLLATERAL
FORFEITURE SCHEDULE**



Pursuant to a vote of the United States District Court Judges of the Southern District of Florida, it is hereby

ORDERED that all previous Administrative Orders establishing Southern District of Florida “Collateral Forfeiture Schedules” for the violations of regulations enforced by the Veteran’s Administration, Federal Protective Service, the National Park Service, United States Fish and Wildlife Service, and United States Army Corps of Engineers, including but not limited to Administrative Order 2006-06, are hereby vacated and superseded. Effective from the date of this Order, all forfeiture of collateral on covered offenses shall be handled in accordance with Local Rule 88.3 of the Southern District of Florida and the schedules attached hereto.

Under the attached schedules, collateral may be posted in lieu of the personal appearance of an individual charged with certain covered offenses under the laws and regulations of the United States. The posting of such collateral shall signify that the person accused does not wish to appear nor request a hearing. Collateral so posted shall be forfeited to the United States and the proceeding shall be terminated. Collateral may not be posted for any covered offense if the alleged violator has been previously convicted of any such offense.

If a person charged with a covered offense for which collateral is required fails to post and forfeit collateral, any punishment, including fine, imprisonment, or probation may be

imposed within the limits established by law upon a conviction by guilty plea or after trial. No person shall be detained for failure to post collateral for a covered offense for which collateral may be posted unless the person is placed under arrest.

Nothing here shall prohibit a law enforcement officer from arresting an alleged violator for commission of any offense, including those for which collateral may be posted or mandatory appearance required, and forthwith notifying a United States Magistrate Judge for the purpose of appearance or setting bail.

Offenses for which collateral may be posted in lieu of appearance and the amounts of said collateral are shown on each of the six schedules attached hereto. Said schedules, which cover regulations enforced by the Veteran's Administration, Federal Protective Service, the National Park Service, United States Fish and Wildlife Service, United States Army Corps of Engineers, and the United States Navy shall become effective upon the date of this Order and remain on file with the Clerk as a public record without the necessity for publication as part of the Local Rules.

Title 36, Code of Federal Regulations Part 327
Rules and Regulations Governing Public Use of
Corps of Engineers Water Resources Development Projects

327.1 Policy

(d) All water resource development projects open for public use shall be available to the public without regard to sex, race, color, creed, age, nationality or place of origin. No lessee, licensee, or concessionaire providing a service to the public shall discriminate against any person because of sex, race, color, creed, age, nationality or place of origin in the conduct of operations under the lease, license or concession contract. \$50

327.2 Vehicles

(b) Vehicles shall not be parked in violation of posted restrictions and regulations, or in such a manner as to obstruct or impede normal or emergency traffic movement or the parking of other vehicles, create a safety hazard, or endanger any person, property or environmental feature. Vehicles so parked are subject to removal and impoundment at the owner's expense. \$50

(c) The operation and/or parking of a vehicle off authorized roadways is prohibited except at locations and times designated by the District Commander. Taking any vehicle through, around or beyond a restrictive sign, recognizable barricade, fence or traffic control barrier is prohibited. \$50

(d) Vehicles shall be operated in accordance with posted restrictions and regulations. \$50

(e) No person shall operate any vehicle in a careless, negligent or reckless manner so as to endanger any person, property or environmental feature. \$100

(f) At designated recreation areas, vehicles shall be used only to enter or leave the area or individual sites or facilities unless otherwise posted. \$50

(g) Except as authorized by the District Commander, no person shall operate any motorized vehicle without a proper and effective exhaust muffler as defined by state and local laws, or with an exhaust muffler cutout open, or in any other manner which renders the exhaust muffler ineffective in muffling the sound of engine exhaust. \$50

327.3 Vessels

(b) The placement and/or operation of any vessel or watercraft for a fee of profit upon project waters or lands is prohibited except as authorized by permit, lease, license, or concession contract with the Department of Army. This paragraph shall not apply to the operation of commercial tows or passenger carrying vessels not based at a Corps project which utilize project waters as a link in continuous transit over navigable waters of the United States. \$50

(c) Vessels or other watercraft may be operated on the project with posted regulations and restrictions, including buoys. \$50

All vessels or watercraft so required by applicable Federal, state and local laws shall display an appropriate registration on board whenever the vessel is on project waters. \$50

(d) No person shall operate any vessel or other watercraft in a careless, negligent, or reckless manner so as to endanger any person, property, or environmental feature. \$100

(e) All vessels, when on project waters, shall have safety equipment, including personal flotation devices, on board in compliance with U.S. Coast Guard boating safety requirements and in compliance with boating safety laws issued and enforced by the state in which the vessel is located. Owners or operators of vessels not in compliance with this section may be requested to remove the vessel immediately from project waters until such time as items of non-compliance are corrected. \$50

(f) Unless otherwise permitted by Federal, state or local law, vessels or other watercraft, while moored in commercial facilities, community or corporate docks, or at any fixed or permanent mooring point, may only be used for overnight occupancy when such is incidental to recreational boating. \$50

Vessels or other watercraft are not to be used as a place of habitation or residence. \$75

(g) Water skis, parasails, ski-kites and similar devices are permitted in non-restricted areas except that they may not be used in a careless negligent, or reckless manner so as to endanger any person, property or environmental feature. \$100

(h) Vessels shall not be attached or anchored to structures such as locks, dams, buoys or other structures unless authorized by District Commander. All vessels when not in actual use shall be removed from project lands and water unless securely moored or stoned at designated areas approved by the District Commander. The placing of floating or stationary mooring facilities on, adjacent to, or interfering with a buoy, channel marker or other navigational aid is prohibited. \$100

(i) The use at a projected of any vessel not constructed or maintained in compliance with the standards and requirements established by the Safe Boating Act of 1971 (Public Law 92-75, 85 Stat. 213), or promulgated pursuant to such act, is prohibited. \$50

(j) Except as authorized by the District Commander, no person shall operate any vessel or watercraft without a proper and effective exhaust muffler as defined by state and local laws, or with an exhaust muffler cutout open, or in any other manner which renders the exhaust muffler ineffective in muffling the sound of engine exhaust. \$50

327.4 Aircraft

(b) The operation of aircraft on project lands at locations other than those designated by the District Commander is prohibited. This provision shall not be applicable to aircraft engaged on official business of Federal, state or local governments or law enforcement agencies, aircraft used in emergency rescue in accordance with the directions of the District Commander or aircraft forced to land due to circumstances beyond the control of the operator. \$75

(c) No person shall operate any aircraft while on or above project waters or project lands in a careless or reckless manner so as to endanger any person, property or environmental feature. \$125

(e) Except in extreme emergencies threatening human life or serious property loss, the air delivery or retrieval of any person, material or equipment by parachute, balloon, helicopter, or other means onto or from project lands or waters without written permission of the District Commander is prohibited. \$75

(f) In addition to the provisions in paragraph (a) through (e) of this section, seaplanes are subject to the following restrictions:

(2) Seaplane operations contrary to the prohibitions or restrictions established by the District Commander (pursuant to part 328 of this title) are prohibited. The responsibility to ascertain whether seaplane operations are prohibited or restricted is incumbent upon the person(s) contemplating the use of, or using, such waters. \$75

(3) All operations of seaplanes while upon project waters shall be in accordance with U.S. Coast Guard navigation rules for powerboats or vessels and Sec. 327.3. \$75

- (4) Seaplanes on project waters and lands in excess of 24 hours shall be securely moored at mooring facilities and at locations permitted by the District Commander. Seaplanes may be temporarily moored on project waters and lands, except in areas prohibited by the District Commander, for periods less than 24 hours providing:
 - (i) The mooring is safe, secure, and accomplished so as not to damage the rights of the Government or members of the public, and
 - (ii) The operator remains in the vicinity of the seaplane and reasonably available to relocate the plane if necessary.

(5) Commercial operation of seaplanes from project waters is prohibited without written approval of the District Commander following consultation with and necessary clearance from the Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) and other appropriate public authorities and affected interests. \$75

(6) Seaplanes may not be operated at Corps projects between sunset and sunrise unless approved by the District Commander. \$75

327.5 Swimming

(a) Swimming, wading, snorkeling or scuba diving at one's own risk is permitted, except at launching sites, designated mooring points and public docks, or other areas so designated by the District Commander. \$50

(b) An international diver down, or inland diving flag must be displayed during underwater activities. \$50

(c) Diving, jumping or swinging from trees bridges or other structures which cross or are adjacent to project waters is prohibited. \$50

324.6 Picnicking

Picnicking and related day-use activities are permitted, except in those areas where prohibited by the District Commander. \$50

327.7 Camping

(a) Camping is permitted only at sites and/or areas designated by the District Commander. \$50

(b) Camping at one or more campsites at any one water resource project for a period longer than 14 days, during any consecutive 30-day period is prohibited without the written permission of the District Commander. \$50

(c) The unauthorized placement of camping equipment or other items on a campsite and/or personal appearance at a campsite without daily occupancy for the purpose of reserving that campsite for future occupancy is prohibited. \$50

(d) The digging or leveling of any ground or the construction of any structure \$50

without written permission of the District Commander is prohibited

(e) Occupying or placement of any camping equipment at a Campsite which is posted or otherwise marked or Indicated as "reserved" without an authorized reservation for that site is prohibited. \$50

327.8 Hunting, fishing and trapping

(a) Hunting is permitted except in areas and during periods where prohibited by the District Commander. \$50

(b) Trapping is permitted except in areas and during periods where prohibited by the District Commander. \$50

(c) Fishing is permitted except in areas and during periods where prohibited by the District Commander. \$50

327.9 Sanitation

(a) Garbage, trash, rubbish, litter, gray water, or any other waster material or waste liquid generated on the project area and incidental to authorized recreational activities shall be either removed from the project or deposited in receptacles provided for that purpose. The improper disposal of such wastes, human and animal waste include, on the project is prohibited. \$100

(b) It is a violation to bring onto a project any household or commercial garbage, trash, rubbish, debris, dead animals or litter of any kind for disposal or dumping without the written permission of the District Commander. For the purposes of this section, the owner of any garbage, trash, rubbish, debris, dead animals or litter of any kind shall be presumed to be responsible for proper disposal. Such presumption will be sufficient to issue a citation for violation. \$150

(c) The spilling, pumping, discharge or disposal of contaminants pollutants or other wastes, including but not limited to. Human or animal waste, petroleum. Industrial and commercial products and by-products. on project lands or into project waters is prohibited. \$100

(d) Campers, picnickers and an all other person, using a water resources development project shall keep their sites free of trash and litter during the period of occupancy and shall remove all personal equipment and clean their sites upon departure. \$50

(e) The discharge or placing of sewage, galley waste, garbage, refuse, or pollutants into the project waters from any vessel or watercraft is prohibited. \$100

327.10 Fires

(a) Gasoline and other fuels, except that which is contained in storage tanks of vehicles, vessels, camping equipment or hand portable containers designed for such purpose, shall not be carried onto or stores on the project without written permission of the District Commander. \$50

(b) Fires shall be confined to those areas designated by the District Commander, and shall be contained in fireplaces, grills, or other facilities designated for this purpose. Fires shall not be left unattended and must be completely extinguished prior to departure. The burning of materials that produce toxic fumes, including, but not limited to, tires, plastic, and other flotation material, or treated wood products is prohibited. The District Commander may prohibit open burning of any type for environmental considerations. \$75

(c) Improper disposal of lighted smoking materials, matches or other burning material is prohibited. \$50

327.11 Control of animals

(a) No person shall bring or allow dogs, cats or other pets into developed recreation area, or adjacent waters unless penned, caged, on a leash under six feet in length, or otherwise physically restrained. No person shall allow animals to impede or restrict otherwise full and free use of project lands and waters by the public. No person shall allow animals to bark or emit other noise which unreasonably disturbs other people. Animals and pets, except those properly trained animals assisting those with disabilities (such as seeing-eye-dogs), prohibited in sanitary facilities, playgrounds, swimming beaches and any other area, so designated by the District Commander. Abandonment of any animal on project land or waters is prohibited. Unclaimed or unattended animals are subject to immediate impoundment and removal in accordance with state and local laws. \$50

(b) Persons bringing or allowing pets in designated public use areas shall be responsible for proper removal and disposal of any waste produced by these animals. \$50

(c) No person shall bring or allow horses, cattle, or other livestock in camping, picnicking, swimming or other recreation areas or on trails except in areas designated by the District Commander. \$50

(d) Ranging, grazing, watering or allowing livestock on project lands and waters is prohibited except when authorized by lease, license or other written agreement with the District Commander. \$50

(g) Wild or exotic pets and animals (including, but not limited to cougars, lions, bears, bobcats, wolves and snakes), or any other pets or animals displaying vicious or aggressive behavior or other-wise posing a threat to public safety or deemed a public nuisance, are prohibited from project lands and waters unless \$100

authorized by the District Commander, and are subject to removal in accordance with Federal, state and local laws.

372.12 Restrictions

(a) The District Commander may establish and post a schedule of visiting hours and/or restrictions on the public use of a project or portion of a project. The District Commander may close or restrict the use of a project or portion of a project when necessitated by reason of public health, public safety, maintenance, and resource protection or other reasons in the public interest. Entering or using a project in a manner contrary to the schedule of visiting hours, closures or a restriction is prohibited. \$50

(b) Quiet shall be maintained in all public use areas between the hours of 10 p.m. and 6 a.m., or those hours designated by the District Commander. Excessive noise during such times which unreasonably disturbs persons is prohibited. \$50

(c) Any act or conduct by any person which interferes with, impedes or disrupts the use of the project or impairs the safety of any person is prohibited. Individuals who are boisterous, rowdy, disorderly, or otherwise disturb the peace on project lands or waters may be requested to leave the project. \$100

(d) The operation or use of any sound producing or motorized equipment, including but not limited to generators, vessels, or vehicles, in such a manner as to unreasonably annoy or endanger persons at any time or exceed state or local laws governing noise levels from motorized equipment is prohibited. \$50

(e) The possession and/or consumption of alcoholic beverages on any portion of the project land or waters, or the entire project, may be prohibited when designated and posted by the District Commander. \$50

(f) Unless authorized by the District Commander, smoking is prohibited in Visitor Centers, enclosed park buildings and in areas posted to restrict smoking. \$50

327.13 Explosives, firearms, other weapons and fireworks

(a) The possession of loaded firearms, ammunition, loaded projectile firing devices, bows and arrows, crossbows, or other weapons is prohibited unless: \$75

- (1) In the possession of a Federal, state or local law enforcement officer
- (3) Being used for hunting or fishing as permitted under Sec. 327.8 with devices being unloaded when transported
- (5) Being used at authorized shootings ranges; or
- (4) Written permission has been received from the District Commander

(b) Possession of explosives or explosive devices of any kind, including fireworks or other pyrotechnics, is prohibited unless written permission has been received from the District Commander. \$75

327.14 Public property

(a) Destruction, in jury, defacement, removal or any alteration of public property including, but not limited to, developed facilities, natural formations, mineral deposits, historical and archaeological features, paleontological resources, boundary documentation or markers and vegetative growth, is prohibited except when in accordance with written permission of the District Commander. \$100

(b) Cutting or gathering of trees or parts of trees and/or the removal of wood from project lands is prohibited without written permission of the District Commander. \$100

(d) The use of metal detectors is permitted on designated beaches or other previously disturbed areas unless prohibited by the District Commander for reasons of protection of archaeological, historical or paleontological resources. Items found must be handled in accordance with Sections 327.15 and 327.16 except for non-identifiable items such as coins of value less than \$25.00. \$50

327.15 Abandonment and Impoundment of personal property

(a) Personal property of any kind shall not be abandoned, stored, or left unattended upon project lands or waters. After a period of 24 hours or at any time after a posted closure hour in a public use area or for the purpose of providing public safety or resource protection, unattended personal property shall be presumed to be abandoned and may be impounded and stored at a storage point designated by the District Commander, who assesses a reasonable impoundment fee. Such a fee shall be paid before the impounded property is returned to its owner. \$50

327.16 Lost and found articles

(a) All articles found shall be deposited by the finder at the Manager's office or with a ranger. All such articles shall be disposed of in accordance with the procedures set forth in 327.15. \$50

327.17 Advertisement

(a) Advertising and the distribution of printed matter is allowed within project land and waters provided that a permit to do so has been issued by the District Commander and provided this activity is not solely commercial advertising. \$50

(c) Vessels and vehicles with semi-permanent or permanent painted or installed signs are exempt as long as they are used for authorized recreational activities and comply with all other rules and regulations pertaining to vessels and vehicles. \$50

327.18 Commercial activities

(a) The engaging in or solicitation of business on project land or waters without the express written permission of the District Commander is prohibited. \$50

(b) It shall be a violation of this part to refuse or fail to comply with any terms, clauses, or conditions of any lease, license or agreements issued by the District Commander. \$50

327.19 Permits

(a) It shall be a violation of this part to refuse or fail to comply with the fee requirements or other terms or conditions of any permit issued under the provisions of this part 327. \$50

(e) Shoreline Use Permits to authorize private shoreline use facilities, activities or development (issued under the authority of 327.30) may be issued in accordance with the project Shoreline Management Plan. Failure to comply with the permit conditions issued under 327.30 is prohibited. \$50

327.20 Unauthorized structures

The construction, placement, or existence of any structures (including, but not limited to, roads, trails, signs, non-portable hunting stands or blinds, buoys, docks, or landscape features) of any kind under, upon, In or over the project lands, or waters is prohibited unless a permit, lease, license or other appropriate written authorization has been issued by the District Commander. The design, construction, placement, existence or use of structures in violation of the terms of the permit, lease, license, or other written authorization is prohibited. The government shall not be liable for the loss of, or damage to, any private structures, whether \$75

authorized or not, placed on project lands or waters. Unauthorized structures are subject to summary removal or impoundment by the District Commander. Portable hunting stands, climbing devices, steps, or blinds, that are not nailed or screwed into trees and are removed at the end of a day's hunt may be used.

327.21 Special events

(a) Special events including, but not limited to, water carnivals, boat regattas, fishing tournaments, music festivals, dramatic presentations or other special recreation programs are prohibited unless written permission has been granted by the District Commander. An appropriate fee may be charged under the authority of Sec. 327.23. \$50

(b) The public shall not be charged any fee by the sponsor of such event unless the District Commander has approved in writing (and the sponsor has properly posted) the proposed schedule of fees. The District Commander shall have authority to revoke permission, require removal of any equipment, and require restoration of an area to pre-event condition, upon failure of the sponsor to comply with terms and conditions of the permit/permission or the regulations in this part 327. \$50

327.22 Unauthorized occupation

(a) Occupying any lands, buildings, vessels, or other facilities within water resource development projects for the purpose of maintaining the same as full or part-time residence without the written permission of the District Commander is prohibited. The provisions of this section shall not apply to occupation of lands for the purpose of camping, in accordance with the provisions of 327.7. \$75

(b) Use of project lands and waters for agricultural purposes is prohibited except when in compliance with terms and conditions authorized by lease, license or other written agreement issued by the District Commander. \$50

327.23 Recreation use fees

(b) Failure to pay authorized recreation use fees as established pursuant to Pub. L. 88-578 Stat. 897, as amended (16 U.S.C. 4601-6a), is prohibited and is punishable by a fine of not more than \$100.00. \$50

(c) Failure to pay authorized day use fees, and or properly display applicable receipt, permit or pass is prohibited. \$50

(d) Fraudulent use of a Golden Age or Golden Access Passport is prohibited. \$50

327.24 Interference with Government Employees

(a) It is a federal crime pursuant to the provisions of Sections 111 and 1114 of Title 18, United States Code. to forcibly assault, resist, oppose, impede, intimidate, or interfere with, attempt to kill or kill any civilian official or employee of the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers engaged in the performance of his or her official duties. Mandatory Court Appearance

(b) Failure to comply with a lawful order issued by a Federal employee acting pursuant to the regulations in this part shall be considered as interference with that employee while engaged in the performance of their official duties. Such interference with a Federal employee includes failure to provide a correct name, address or other information deemed necessary for identification upon request of the Federal employee, when that employee is authorized by the District Commander to issue citations in the performance of the employee's official duties. \$50
