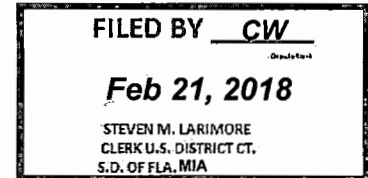

ORDER OF SUSPENSION

The Supreme Court of Florida entered an Order of Suspension dated January 23, 2018, suspending Terra Neshonda Carroll from the practice of law. *See The Florida Bar v. Carroll*, No. SC18-120, 2018 WL 508669 (Fla. Jan. 23, 2018). The suspension is predicated on a Notice of Determination or Judgment of Guilt, which disclosed that Ms. Carroll was found guilty of Fleeing and Eluding a Police Officer, a felony, and Resisting an Officer without Violence, a misdemeanor, before the First Judicial Circuit Court in and for Santa Rosa County, Florida on January 9, 2018. *See State of Florida v. Terra Neshonda Carroll*, Case No. 5716CF001406A (Fla. 1st Cir. Ct. Jan. 9, 2018).

Rule 7(a) of the Rules Governing the Admission, Practice, Peer Review, and Discipline of Attorneys, Local Rules of the United States District Court for the Southern District of Florida, provides that “[u]pon the filing with this Court of a certified copy of a judgment of conviction demonstrating that any attorney admitted to practice before the Court has been convicted in any court of the United States . . . of any serious crime . . . the Court shall enter an order immediately suspending that attorney.” A “serious crime” has been defined by Rule 7(b) to “include any felony.”

Pursuant to Rule 7(a) and (b), and the Court’s inherent power to regulate membership in its bar for the protection of the public interest, *see Chambers v. NASCO, Inc.*, 501 U.S. 32, 43 (1991) (“[A] federal court has the power to control admission to its bar and to discipline attorneys who appear before it.”),

IT IS ORDERED that said attorney be suspended from practice in this Court, effective immediately. The attorney may not resume the practice of law before this Court until reinstated by order of this Court. See Rule 12(a).

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the Clerk of Court shall strike this attorney from the roll of attorneys eligible to practice in the United States District Court for the Southern District of Florida, and shall also immediately revoke the attorney's CM/ECF password.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED by this Court that said attorney advise the Clerk of Court of all pending cases before this Court in which she is counsel or co-counsel of record.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED by this Court that the Clerk of Court attempt to serve by certified mail a copy of this Order of Suspension upon the attorney at her court record and Florida Bar addresses.
