The Committee Regarding Fort Lauderdale Federal Courthouse was formed in 2009 as a forum for Judges, community leaders, and legal practitioners to discuss issues relating to the Southern District of Florida's federal courthouse in Broward County. Since its inception, the Committee has worked tirelessly to recommend improvements to the facilities and to expose safety and security concerns that have plagued the federal courthouse in Broward County for many years. In addition, the Committee strenuously advocated for construction of a long overdue new federal courthouse in Broward County. In 2019, Congressional funding was allocated for a new federal courthouse in Fort Lauderdale. In 2021, a site for this new federal courthouse was purchased, and the design phase of the project is well underway. Accordingly, it is hereby

ORDERED that the Committee Regarding Fort Lauderdale Federal Courthouse is dissolved immediately. The Court wishes to express sincere gratitude to the Committee members for their time, dedication, and support of the Court and the federal court community in Broward County.
